We find God to the degree we *want* to find him. Until our passion for finding God exceeds all other passions, and until we long to know him as our Lord and friend more than to use him to get what we want (the way a spoiled child uses a rich father), we will not find him as deeply as he longs to be found. ... God wants to let us find him. ... God delights to be discovered. He is not playing hard to get. Something about the way we are and who he is makes it necessary for us to want him more than we want anyone or anything else before we can find him. "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you.' declares the LORD." (Jeremiah 29:13-14) (Larry Crabb, *Finding God*)

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Hearing God is but one dimension of a richly interactive relationship, and obtaining guidance is but one facet of hearing God. . . . Hearing God makes sense only in the framework of living in the will of God. . . . I fear that many people seek to hear God solely as a device for obtaining their own safety, comfort and sense of being righteous. . . . Nothing will go right in our effort to hear God if this false motivation is its foundation.

God simply will not cooperate. . . . in our attempts to understand how God speaks to us and guides us we must, above all, hold on to the fact that learning how to hear God is to be sought *only as a part of a certain kind of life*, a life of loving fellowship with the King . . . We must therefore make it our primary goal not just to hear the voice of God, but to be mature people in a loving relationship with him. Only in this way will we hear him rightly.
